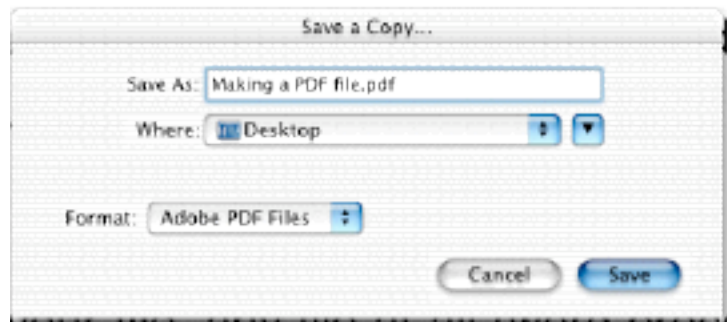


Making a PDF File in MacOSX

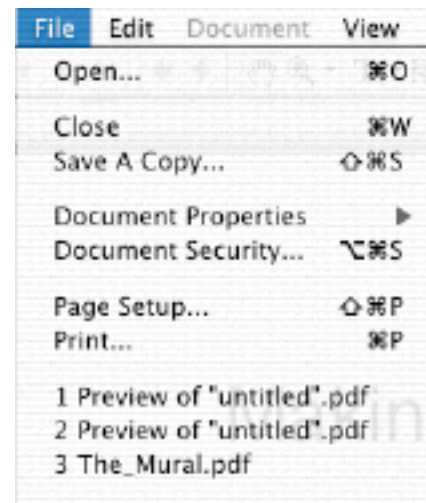
You can make a PDF file, just like those made with Adobe Acrobat, just using the tools provided free, with Mac System 10 (aka "OSX")



Here's how you do it.

Just create your file, any file at all (word processing, spreadsheet, drawing, etc...) in an OSX application.

Pull down the **File** menu to **Print**.



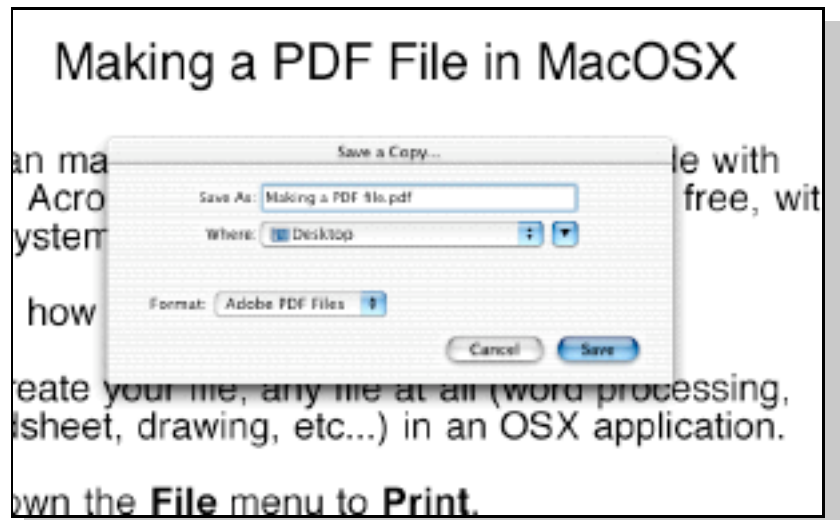
In the print dialog box, click on the **Preview** button.

Your document will open in Acrobat Reader™.



When the document opens as a pdf file, check to make sure it looks the way you want it. (There are some images and tables that Acrobat will alter in some way).

If you're happy with the appearance of the file, pull down the **File** menu to **Save a copy...**



In this dialog box, rename the file as you like. It is recommended that you include the “.pdf” file extension. By doing this, you’ll be able to refer to this file for web page display.

It is also a good idea to avoid using spaces in the file name (you can use underscores “_” to mimick spaces if you like).

Here is the file saved on the desktop.
